The Digital Life Story project transforms everyday experiences into vibrant narratives through music, storytelling, film and photography. It is particularly aimed at people at risk of developing dementia. The Digital Life Story project amplifies the voices of supported individuals. A photograph or favourite song can reveal unexpected aspects of someone's life. This allows for us to connect on a deeper, more empathetic level, as well as creatively ensuring the person's identity is preserved and cherished during challenging life transitions. We use the free app called Our Story 2. On the app, you make chapters about where you came from, your family and friends, special memories like birthdays and celebrations,



as well as things that you like to do or are good at. We have set up a Life Story club that meets twice a month on the EHUB where we share our stories and the creative ideas we have had.
